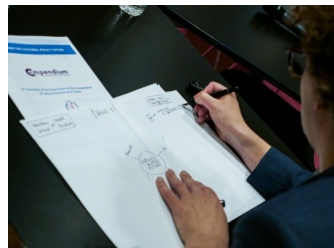

## The 2019 Compendium Assembly in Paris

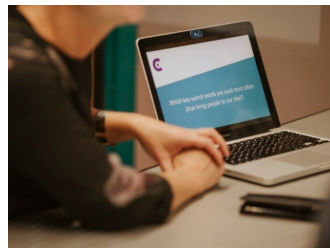
The 2nd Assembly of the Compendium of Cultural Policies and Trends' Association (Paris, June 5th-6th) was a great success! We published a report on the homepage of [Culturalpolicies.net](http://Culturalpolicies.net), containing summaries of the sessions that took place within the frame of our theme *Imagining the cultural policy future* - from presentations and panel debates to keynote speeches.

According to Professor Eleonora Belfiore, one of our speakers, we need an activist research agenda in order to solve the moral crisis that cultural policy faces. Public cultural institutions and funders should be held accountable for the systematic exploitation of the cultural workers involved, Belfiore stated. In his speech, Professor Emeritus Yudhishthir Raj Isar deconstructed the complex notion of cultural sustainability whilst arguing for an ideal cultural policy that embraces sustainability.
