We have published the updated cultural policy profile of Lithuania in our database, written by Compendium expert Audronė Rimkutė. An important development has been Lithuania's adoption of a cultural policy strategy for 2020-2030. The strategy includes the following four objectives: to strengthen the cooperation between the state, municipalities and non-governmental actors, and reduce cultural exclusion and inequalities; to stimulate creation and participation in culture; to develop critical thinking and citizenship within the society; and to create sustainable social and economic value of culture for national progress.
