Sweden joins the Compendium Association

The *Swedish Agency for Cultural Policy Analysis* is assigned by the Government of Sweden to evaluate, analyse and present the effects of proposals and measures taken in the cultural field. This is to be done based on the cultural policy objectives.

Similar to the Compendium the aim of the Agency is to provide a substantial

contribution to the development of cultural policy, to support the government and in this way create better prerequisites for those active in the cultural field



Updated COVID-19 reports from Albania and Austria

Main message from the <u>Albanian COVID-19 report</u> on the impact of the pandemic to the cultural sector is: "Culture is OPEN with a few restrictions"

The Albania report gives an clear and short overview of the recent reopening measures as well as the restrictions and difficulties the cultural sector occurred during the COVID-19 crisis.

The recently updated **Austrian report** shows current information on the general support as well as sector-specific measures by the Federal Government. The report compiles the existing COVID-19 regulations for cultural institutions and the recent reopening measures in Austria. For example:

As from 1 July 2021 there will be no more restrictions regarding distance, capacity and closing hour; simple mouth-nose-masks have to be used in public transport and retail. Public events have to apply the 3-G rule (tested, recovered, vaccinated), there will be no more capacity limitation, however, a notification duty over 100 persons and an authorization requirement over 500 persons.
