First short cultural policy profile of Armenia

Thanks to our experts Yulia Antonyan and Haykuhi Muradyan we can present a <u>first short cultural policy profile of Armenia</u> on the Compendium.

Short profiles aim to summarise the cultural policy profiles from the <u>database</u> and give a quick overview of the most important elements of a country's cultural policy. Below some of recent changes and developments regarding Armenian cultural policy:

- The new government programme of June 2021 does not address culture separately, but includes it in the general concept of "development of human potential".
- A proposed new Law on Education was accepted by the Assembly in 2021 but it has been delayed by the Constitutional Court.
- Local and pan-Armenian digital platforms for culture and education have become a very timely and acute issue in the period of the pandemic.
- A draft of a new National Strategy for Protection of Cultural Heritage (2021-2025) is under public debate.
- The post Azerbaijani-Armenian war (2020) and the pandemic forced the government to reconsider its strategies for heritage protection and to place a stronger focus on creativity, infrastructural development and modern technologies.

Updated long cultural policy profile for North Macedonia

An <u>updated long cultural policy profile for North Macedonia</u> is now available thanks to our Compendium expert **Zlatko Teodosievski**.Below some of the current changes, new developments and data regarding North Macedonia:

- Culture's share of the central state budget in 2020 was 0.16% (0.12% in 2019), almost the lowest rate in the past 20 years. On the other hand, the cultural budget for 2020 was almost 47% higher than the budget for 2019.
- In the 2021 budget for protection of cultural heritage there is for the first time a fund for protection of cultural heritage in danger.
- To evaluate the need for a separate law for the performing arts, a working group was established and the proposal is now being evaluated.
- A new Law on exercising public interest in culture was prepared (2019) and awaits Parliamentary procedure.
- A draft of a new National Strategy for Protection of Cultural Heritage (2021-2025) is under public debate.
